

Distance learning extended until 22.01.21

Unfortunately, high infection rates continue to determine our daily routine and thus also our planning for the lessons. Really reliable infection figures will probably only be available in the week between 11.1. and 15.1. and then determine the further measures. After the last Ministerpräsident*innen-Konferenz (MPK) on 5.1.2021 with the Chancellor, the following guidelines for our school operations were communicated (original letter from the Minister):

1. period until January 15, 2021.

It remains with the already communicated regulations: Distance education for all students. At the same time, schools will remain open for emergency care for students who cannot be cared for by their parents and for those who need special support or do not have a conducive learning environment at home, for example, because they do not have good spatial or technical infrastructure; thus, they will have the opportunity to learn at school. Prior registration is required for emergency care.

2. period January 18 to January 22, 2021.

The measures described above will be extended for one week, i.e. distance learning will continue for all students.

3. period January 25 to January 29, 2021

The decision of the MPK of 05.01.21 opens up the possibility of bringing more children to school when the incidence of infection decreases, while lifting the obligation to be present (=parents are allowed to leave their children at home). Alternating classes could then take place for the students* in the elementary schools: Classes would be divided and have alternating daily face-to-face instruction and home-based practice time. One or more "support groups" for basic support of children with special needs can be formed, which receive daily face-to-face instruction. Emergency care groups are offered as before. However, if the number of cases remains high, distance learning may have to be continued.
